- The patient says "DOCTOR, I don't want XYZ..."
- Your job is to seek to understand the rational. Is it fear? Financial? Lack of understanding? In a hurry?

Somethings are optional, and some things are not optional.

If you treat someone in the NOT OPTIONAL category:

- You are providing substandard care
- This is considered supervised neglect
- Dismiss the patient

Useful one-liners:

- o Without a proper diagnosis, I cannot treat you.
- Without taking radiographs, I am working in the dark.
- This is what I am willing to do.
- o It sounds like I am not the right doctor for you.
- I will need you to sign the informed refusal form, and here is a list of local dental clinics you can try out to find a better fit.
- I recommend you consult with another dentist to see if they can meet your expectations.

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
