## **Post-Operative Instructions for Complete Dentures**

### SORE SPOTS:

- Sore spots are common and will require adjustment appointments.
- The sore spots will not go away on their own and may cause excess tissue growth requiring surgical removal.
- Make sure to wear the denture several hours prior to adjustment appointments to help the dentist locate the sore spots.

#### HYGIENE:

- Denture Hygiene:
  - Clean after every meal as food will become trapped beneath the dentures.
  - Clean over sink full of water or towel to avoid breakage if it drops.
  - Clean with denture brush, cold to warm water, and antibacterial soap.
    - Do not clean with toothpaste (too abrasive)
    - Do not place in boiling water <sup>8</sup> (can warp)
  - If using a denture cleansing solution (such as Polident), thoroughly rinse and brush denture prior to wearing.

  - If using denture adhesives, the adhesive must be thoroughly removed from the denture and oral cavity daily.

## Oral Hygiene:

- Clean your gums with soft toothbrush and warm water 2 times a day for 2 minutes.
- Clean your tongue with tongue scraper.

#### STORAGE:

- Do not wear partials when you sleep.
  - Wearing all day and all night will cause harm to the gums, bone, and mouth.
  - The gums need adequate blood circulation for 8 hours a day.
  - Failure to let your gums rest will cause the ridge support to become flatter sooner and the denture and future dentures will be harder to fit properly.<sup>2</sup>
  - You can develop fungal infections from over wearing especially with poor hygiene.
- Always keep the partials moist whether:
  - In mouth
  - In a container with water (away from pets)
  - In a sealed bag with water
- If it becomes dehydrated it will warp and no longer fit.

#### CHEWING:

- Be patient, it usually takes 6-8 weeks to adapt to a new prosthesis.
- Begin with soft foods and cut the food into small pieces.
- Chew food on both sides simultaneously to reduce denture tipping.
- Careful with hot foods and drinks. May burn tissue.

#### SPEECH:

- Be patient, can take 2-4 weeks to adapt.
- Pronunciation, such as "s" and "f" may be difficult in the beginning, practice reading aloud in mirror.
- May help to swallow first to "set" denture in place. You will be more aware of speech problems than other people.

## PRECAUTIONS:

- Do not drop the dentures, they can break.
- Cover your mouth when you sneeze, or the dentures can fly out of your mouth and break if they land on a hard surface.
- Do not store the dentures in a napkin/tissue/paper towel, these get accidently thrown away

### • FUTURE APPOINTMENTS:

- Return for recall exams for:
  - Oral cancer screenings
  - Evaluation of the gums
  - Cleaning of the dentures
  - Evaluation of the dentures. Dentures may require relines, repairs, and remakes. Replacement may be needed every 5-10 years.

<sup>\*</sup>If immediate denture, instruct patient to wear denture for 24-48 hours, if remove for >30 mins may not fit due to swelling. Remove only after eating to clean and insert immediately.
