Post-Operative Instructions for Partial Dentures

- WHAT TO EXPECT:
 - Sore spots are common and will require adjustment appointments.
 - Excess saliva is normal the first week.
 - Pronunciation, such as "s" and "f" may be difficult in the beginning, practice reading aloud in mirror
 - Chewing can take time to adapt to.

HYGIENE:

- Partial Denture Hygiene:
 - Clean the partial after every meal.
 - Clean with a denture brush, cold to warm water, and antibacterial soap.
 - Do not clean with toothpaste (too abrasive).
 - Clean over sink full of water or towel to avoid breakage if it drops.
- Oral Hygiene:
 - It is important to maintain good oral hygiene as partials increase the plaque retention and risk of getting cavities.
 - Brush after breakfast with the partials out of mouth.
 - Floss and brush at bedtime with the partials out of mouth.

STORAGE:

- Do not wear the partials when you sleep.
 - The gums need adequate blood circulation, and you can develop fungal infections from over-wearing, especially with poor hygiene.
- Always keep the partials moist whether:
 - In the mouth
 - In a container with water (away from pets)
 - In a sealed bag with water
- If it becomes dehydrated it will warp and no longer fit.

PRECAUTIONS:

- Do not bite the partial into place:
 - Insert and remove with both hands.
- Do not drop the partials, they can break.
- Do not store the partials in a napkin/tissue/paper towel, these get accidently thrown away.
- Careful with hot foods and drinks. May burn the tissue.
- If a partial denture is not worn regularly the teeth will migrate and the bite can change resulting in a partial that may no longer fit. This can create a challenge for making new partials in the future which may require additional procedures.

• FUTURE APPOINTMENTS:

- Return for recall exams and cleanings for both your teeth and partials.
- Partials may require relines, repairs, and remakes.

* If you have Flexible Partials:

- Cleaning:
 - Clean with cold water and anti-bacterial soap.
 - Do not use hot water as the partial will warp and may no longer fit.
 - Do not clean the partial with a toothbrush as it will lose its polish, become rough, and retain debris.
- Remove at night and store the appliance in water in a container away from pets.

- o This appliance is to be used only for appearance and for short-term use.
- o This appliance is not to be worn when eating.
- o Cleaning:
 - Clean with cold water, anti-bacterial soap, and a soft toothbrush.
 - Do not use hot water as the plastic will warp and the appliance may no longer fit.
- Remove at night and store the appliance dry in a container away from pets.
